

A few guidelines for your visit to Hereford Cathedral

In order for your visit to the cathedral to be as enjoyable and trouble free as possible, please would you take the time to read the following brief guidelines.

Preparing for your visit

- Helpers: Please bring at least one adult per every ten children.
- Name labels: It is helpful for the smooth running of your visit if our guides can easily identify teachers and helpers. Clearly written name labels are the easiest way to do this.
- Risk Assessment: Hereford Cathedral is open to the general public, and Health and Safety policies are in place. However, for the safety of the children in your charge, you should complete your own risk assessment. We strongly advise that if you are in any doubt, you should complete this prior to your visit.
- Child Protection: We have our own Child Protection policies, and our education volunteers are all CRB checked. However, the cathedral is a public place and, for the safety of the children in your charge, you should be aware of this at all times.

On Arrival

If you are travelling by coach, you will be dropped off in Broad Street, next to the cathedral. The main entrance is through the North Porch, opposite Church Street. Bring the children into the cathedral and we will meet you as you arrive.

During your visit

Our experienced team of education volunteers will lead your trails and workshops, but it is important to make sure that each group of children is also accompanied by a teacher or helper from your school who knows them.

Toilets

There will be time built into your visit for children to use the toilets. Our toilet facilities are open to all visitors to the cathedral, so it is important for a member of your own staff to accompany the children.
